
Performance Ringing – January 2025

January has bee a quite month for quarter peals with only six being rung in the district.

The first was by the Woodston team of ringers on the 1^{st} January when they rang 1320 New Year Doubles. It was the first in the variation for the band. New Year Doubles is Wollaton Place with Antelope Bob, Yuletide Omit (184x/zy)

It would be a long way into the New Year before another was rung, this time on the 15th at Caxton where a 1320 of Ipswich Surprise Minor was successful. This was Martin Williams first in the method.

The firsts continued on the 21st when a 1260 of Double Bob Minor was rung at Hemingford Abbots. This was first blows in the method for Roger Beaman and Nick Smith and first quarter in the method for all the band. These bells are not rung to quarter peals very much so it is good to hear from them again.

Meanwhile, Bluntisham bells were put to use by a mainly Ely district band on the 17th when they rang a 1344 Plain Bob Major. Standard fare! But they returned on the 24th to ring a 1250 of Yorkshire S Major which was Sharon Williams first in the method.

The monthly quarter peal attempt at Godmanchester this month was Grandsire Triples on the 26th, and as usual was rung immediately before Evensong.



Performance of the month has to go the quarter peal of Bluntisham Bob Minor at **Bluntisham** on the 31st January. This was the first in method for all. I dare say this is a tricky method to ring in parts with two blows in 5th being made on the way up to three blows behind (& visa-versa). Otherwise it is thirds from the back with Buxton Bob front work. The lead ends comprise contiguous places instead of dodges in 3-4.

Wanted - District Bell Advisor

Geoff Burn has been our bell advisor for 10 years, originally as the Huntingdon Bell Restoration Group representative from 2015 and then as the official bell advisor since 2020.

He has knowledgeable experience in maintaining bells since his Hunts Bell Restoration days with Chris Higgins. "Some of us were invited to join the restoration society and soon every Friday evening was devoted to bell work, from maintenance to rehangs, notably Brington, Hargrave, Waresley and Catworth. The bell work, from checking, oiling and tightening to lifting bells made an interesting change to my daytime job as an Accountant. Since retirement, the bell work now takes place in daylight – much safer!" (taken from Geoff's bio on the website)

The committee recognises how difficult it is to replace Geoff's experience but when discussing this with him recently he said, "In many ways the District Bell Advisor needn't get his or her hands dirty because we now have a Diocesan Bell Advisor WhatsApp group of 11, many of whom are willing and do work in other districts. The Hunts District BA could be just an advising & organising role."

Listed below are the current responsibilities for the bell advisor. They are guidelines. The new incumbent can bring to it different skills and interests. The committee is hoping to co-opt someone into the role during 2025 so that a new bell advisor can shadow Geoff and get the feel of what the job will entail. If you think you might be interested please contact Geoff in the first instance.

District Bell Advisor

- Receive enquiries from District Towers and carry out inspections as requested.
- Carry out remedial work if possible as requested or recommended.
- Employ 'bell engineer' volunteers to help with any work as required.
- Liaise with the Association Bell Advisor as required. (Currently one in the same)
- Attend District Committee Meetings.
- Prepare interim reports for presentation to the District Committee or Ringing Meetings as required.
- Prepare a detailed report of the year's activities for presentation at the ADM.

The Newsletter – Ideas for writing an Article PG

Your articles can be about practice nights, learning methods, social events, tower outings, district events, maintenance projects, community and church events – anything to do with ringing.

You needn't write hundreds of words but there will be space whatever the number. The introduction on page 1 is about 260 words. If you send photos too, I can easily dedicate at least half a page for your article

When writing, use the title to attract the reader's attention and explain what the event was, who organised it, what happened, who attended, and any amusing or interesting anecdotes.

Photographs. Groups of people should fill the frame if possible, although I often edit them to suit. Pictures of towers are interesting but if you can easily photograph the bells that's even better, or something interesting in the tower or church which attracts attention.

If you are taking photos of adults or children it is your responsibility to make sure that appropriate permission is given if you are submitting the photos for publication in the newsletter. This can be verbal permission. Please confirm this when submitting photos.

Please send your articles as soon as you can after the event, the deadline each month is quite late – within two or three days of publication which is usually the 1st of the month.
